GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Management:

The competition will be under the working management of the Peace River North Festival Association. Any questions not dealt with in these rules shall be referred to the Festival Committee, in writing. The decision of the committee will be final.

Eligibility:

- 1. PLEASE BE SURE TO READ ALL THE RULES. Performers are responsible for reading and abiding by the rules.
- 2. Competitions are open and eligible to residents of British Columbia or elsewhere. Only British Columbia residents are eligible for the Provincial
- 3. Competitions.All competitions are open to amateurs only. The term 'amateur' shall be defined as a music student or any person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the practice of music.
- 4. Student teachers are considered amateurs as long as they are working under the direction of a qualified teacher.
- 5. 'Adult' classes are 19 years and older and will be divided into beginner and advanced classes.
 - Adult Beginner class: Pre-Grade 1 to Grade 5
 - Adult class: Grade 6 and above
 - Please state grade level on entry form.
- 6. Adult participants will be judged on the quality of their performance and receive a certificate and adjudication but they are not eligible for scholarship awards and trophies, unless specifically designated for adult classes. Adults may be considered for provincial selection if they meet the criteria.

Entries:

- 1. Copies of the Official Syllabus and Entry Forms may be obtained by request by e-mail to <u>peacerivernorthfestival@gmail.com</u> or they are available on the Festival website at <u>https://prn-performingarts.com</u>.
- 2. All entrants must use the official entry from for the current festival year.

- 3. Entries may be submitted by mail to Peace River North Festival, Box 6172, Fort St. John, B.C., V1J 4H7 or by e-mail to <u>prnfa.stage@gmail.com</u>. Entry fees may be paid by cheque, cash or e-transfer.
- 4. All entries must arrive at the above address no later than the entry deadline: March 17, 2023. There will be a penalty of 20% added to the entry fee for late entries.
- 5. Age of competitors is determined as of December 31st before the upcoming Festival.
- 6. Entries should be submitted on one form per person. (add extra forms if space is needed) Entrants participating in more than one category should submit separate entry forms for each category.
- 7. Once an entry is accepted, there will be no refund of entry fee.
- 8. Entry selections may not be changed after entry forms have been received and checked by the Festival Committee.
- 9. Entrants may use a selection only once. If the selection is played in one class, it may not be used in any other class.
- 10. Competitors may not enter the same selection in Own Choice classes in successive years.
- 11. The Festival Committee trusts the integrity of performers to enter the grade level at which they are currently working. If the performer is studying at two levels (i.e. Grades 3 and 4) the performer must perform at the highest level. Entrants who have passed a June exam at one level must enter the competition at the next higher level.
- 12. Entries will not be accepted for classes not appearing in the current syllabus. Anyone wishing to create a new class may apply in writing to the Festival Committee and the class will be considered for inclusion in the syllabus.
- 13. All classes are competitive unless indicated otherwise in the syllabus. Students may enter competitive classes for Adjudication only by so indicating on their entry form.

Program Procedure

- 1. Immediately after the entry list is closed, the Committee will arrange the order of the program. The Committee reserves the right to alter the order of competing and to subdivide the class should the number of entries warrant.
- 2. All particulars, such as time and order of competition, will appear in the Official Program which will be on sale.

Performance

- 1. Performers must adhere to the syllabus class description. Failure to do so will result in disqualification at the time of the performance.
- 2. Competitors are required to submit an <u>ORIGINAL</u> copy of their music at the time of performance for all classes. Music need not be sent in earlier. Because of copyright laws, no photocopies may be handed in. Material from the internet that is not in the public domain must show evidence of copyright and proof of purchase.
- 3. Repeats are not necessary in longer pieces.
- 4. Memorization is considered by most Adjudicators to be a vital part of the total performance and could have an effect on the final markings. Therefore, participants are strongly urged to perform without music or notes, although it is not mandatory unless otherwise specified.
- 5. Please erase all pencil marks and notations on copy to give to the adjudicator.
- 6. Competitors are announced by name or number and a performance will not commence until the Adjudicator indicates.
- 7. The Festival Committee reserves the right to determine the eligibility of any **own choice** classes.
- 8. The quality of the music will be a major criterion used by the Adjudicator in assessing the **own choice** classes.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to disqualify any competitor who is not ready to compete when called upon by the M.C., unless an acceptable reason for the delay has been given in advance. Entrants who intend to withdraw from any class are requested, as a courtesy, to notify the Adjudicator's Secretary, or one of the Festival Committee members, in advance of the appropriate class.
- 10. Performers are responsible for collecting their music and written adjudication after each class. The Festival Association takes no responsibility for the mailing of neglected music of adjudications.
- 11. No competitor will be allowed to use the Festival Performance Halls during the Festival for practice purposes. Any disregard of this regulation could result in disqualification.

12. In all classes, the Adjudicator's decision is final

13. With the exception of festival officials, **no one** may be at the Adjudicator's desk. Any question with regard to the competition must be addressed to a festival official.

Flash photography is not permitted

Marks

- All competitors will receive a certificate of participation.
 Gold: 85% and above
 Silver: 80 84%
 Bronze or Red: 79% or less
 - 2. Marks may be disclosed to the competitor, parent, or teacher at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

Scholarship and Awards

Being the only competitor in a class does not guarantee the competitor a Gold Seal. Standards must be met to warrant an award.

All scholarships are awarded at the absolute discretion of the Adjudicator.

The Festival Committee reserves the right to withhold the granting of any award if, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, a suitable standard has not been attained.

Concerts

Any competitor may be chosen by the Adjudicator to perform at the Honours Concert and should be prepared to appear if requested by a Committee Member. Performers are selected at the discretion of the Adjudicator and are not necessarily restricted to award winners.

Protests and Complaints

1. Complaints and protests must be made to any Festival committee member in writing during the Festival or immediately after, accompanied by a protest fee of \$25.00. Such fee will be returned in full if the protest is upheld.

2. NO INQUIRIES MAY BE ADDRESSED TO THE ADJUDICATOR.

3. Complaints will be reviewed by the festival board and their decision will be final.

B.C. Performing Arts Festival - Provincial Level Competition

- Outstanding students may be selected by the adjudicators to compete in the Performing Arts BC Provincial Festival. Selection of provincial delegates is at the discretion of the adjudicator.
- In order to be considered for recommendation by the adjudicators, a competitor must have performed in at least two solo classes in the same discipline at a local Festival and have received a mark of 85 or over.
- Competitors must be of the required age as of December 31st and be residents of British Columbia. Refer to Provincial Syllabus for specific age and grade requirements. Categories may not be equivalent to those in the local Festival.
- The Adjudicator's decision is final in matters pertaining to adjudication and selection of winners.
- Each provincial discipline has its own standards and requirements. For a complete list of the Provincial Rules and rules for specific Sections, please refer to the Performing Arts BC Provincial Syllabus on their website (**www.performingartsbc.ca**).

Time Limit: 25 minutes

A group of musicians with between three and five years experience, playing two or three contrasting pieces, not to exceed the stated time limit. Five percent of the band membership may exceed the age/experience limit.

A group of musicians under the age of 18, with more than five years experience, playing two or three contrasting pieces not to exceed the stated time limit. Five percent of the band membership may exceed the age limit.

Class 104 Junior Jazz Ensemble

A group of musicians with between three and five years experience, playing two or three contrasting jazz pieces, not to exceed the stated time limit. Five percent of the band membership may exceed the age/experience limit.

Class 105 Senior Jazz Ensemble

A group of musicians with more than five years experience, playing two or three contrasting pieces, not to exceed the stated time limit. Five percent of the band membership may exceed the age limit.

SPEECH AND DRAMATIC ARTS

Rules

- 1. In all levels, performers must verbally introduce the dramatic selection in order to set the scene. These remarks are not included in timing of the selection.
- 2. All selections must be memorized
- 3. Each competitor must submit a copy of the speech arts selections to the adjudicator's secretary prior to the class in which he/she is to perform.
- 4. Definitions for the following guidelines are:

Prose: In prose the speaker is the narrator with focus place on the voice. The selection should include narration description and dialogue. It should be spoken in story-telling style without being performed. For example, there should be no acting. Competitors may stand or be seated.

Drama: In drama the speaker is the character. The selection can be taken from a published play, written for two or more characters, to be presented on the stage by an actor assuming language, movement or dress of the character portrayed. The words should be of one character only, with words of other character omitted. Shakespeare selections must be taken from his plays rather than his non-dramatic poetry. Stand alone monologues are not considered as drama.

Poetry: Speakers may choose to perform either lyric or narrative/dramatic poetry. - Lyric is a short, unified poem expressing the poet's own experience and emotion that is to be presented in a relaxed stance with no movement.

Narrative is a poem which tells story and usually has dialogue. The telling of the telling of the story is the primary concern of the speaker.

Public Speaking: The act or process of making speeches in public. The selection of Public Speaking must be an original extemporaneous speech and not memorized. Notes should be used but not read from. The speech can be persuasive, informational, or entertaining. The topic should be the speaker's choice.

- 5. Suitable dress for the presentation is expected.
- 6. Costumes are permitted for the Drama selection and for Shakespeare classes. Small Props are permitted providing that the competitor can set up such props without assistance. Costumes and props must be integral to the selection. The use of live flame is strictly forbidden.
- 7. The Syllabi published by the major examination bodies, including the Royal Conservatory (Toronto), Conservatory Canada, Trinity College, Mount Royal College, etc., are suggested for grade level guidance in entering local and provincial festivals in Speech Arts. A list of appropriate poetry selections is available from the Peace River North Festival.
